Water bottles

Please fill drink bottles with water only.

Change of clothes

Please remember that we require a full change of clothes to be provided daily.

Antibiotics

Please note that children are excluded from nursery for 24 hours from first administration of prescribed antibiotics (in case of adverse reaction).

Diarrhoea & Vomiting

Home Farm adheres to the UKHSA guidelines, which state that the exclusion period is until the infected person has been free of symptoms for 48 hours.

World Book Day

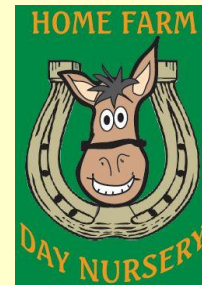


To celebrate World book day on **Thursday 5th March**, children are invited to dress as their favourite book character.
